### REVERSE ADVENT CALENDAR?

Thank you for the over whelming response to the Reverse Advent Calendar. We have families, businesses and classrooms participating, so much so that I have received another pack of 20 boxes for anyone who has missed out.

Another way you can help is by donating a gift that can be given to children in need. These can be left at the Parish office any time between now and the 17<sup>th</sup> December. We have a number of families who are struggling to give their children something at Christmas time.

### What is a Reverse Advent Calendar?

Unlike a regular Advent Calendar where the focus is on receiving a treat every day, the Reverse Advent Calendar takes the focus off receiving and places the focus on giving to others.

A Reverse Advent Calendar begins as an empty box. For 20 days in the lead up to Christmas you place one item (non-perishable food, toiletries, Christmas treat) into the box. After 20 days your filled Reverse Advent Calendar is dropped off to the Parish Office where it will be distributed from the Good Kitchen to people in our immediate community who are experiencing food insecurity.

Boxes and suggestions for items to go in the box are available from the Parish office.

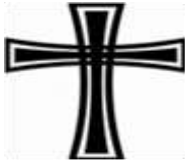

**REFLECTION** by Lisa-Marie Calderone-Stewart  
**God's Word**

A major theme of the Scriptures readings is 'Christ the King'.

The first reading from Daniel foreshadows the return of the Risen Christ as a king sent by God to rule the people. Unlike earthly royalty, who lose their thrones to warring foes or death, Christ's kingship is everlasting. God's Kingdom is described here and in the responsorial psalm as encompassing all on earth and in heaven.

The psalmist sees the Lord in the attire and tribute fitting for a king. However, this king does not wear robes of fine material, but is clothed in strength, trust, and holiness.

The Book of Revelation reveals to us more about the relationship between Jesus and his Father. Jesus is called first a faithful witness – one who witnesses his Father to the world and remains faithful to him. As king over all, Jesus frees captives to serve God as Father. Jesus came first to serve others. But his Second Coming will be in majesty, as on a cloud. Although many kings lose their throne to death, Jesus began his rule through a death that led to our salvation.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus is interrogated by Pilate. Jesus tells him that he is indeed a king but not like the kings and kingdoms of this world. He is not the type of king the people expected or the type authorities of that day would accept. Jesus comes to testify to the truth, meaning that he belongs to God and God's Kingdom, and that all who believe in him also belong to God and God's Kingdom.

We accept Jesus as King and enter the Kingdom of God when we hear and follow the truth of his Word.

Jesus Christ is the faithful witness, the First-born from the dead, the Ruler of the kings of the earth. He loves us and has washed away our sins with his blood, and made us a line of kings, priests to serve his God and Father; to him, then, be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen. It is he who is coming on the clouds; everyone will see him, even those who pierced him, and all the races of the earth will mourn over him. This is the truth. Amen. 'I am the Alpha and the Omega' says the Lord God, who is, who was, and who is to come, the Almighty.

*You say that I am a king.*

'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked. Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord, or have others spoken to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

**New Covid regulations for attending Mass.**

If everyone present is fully vaccinated, you can attend religious ceremonies at places of worship with no capacity limits or density limits. (Vaccination requirements will apply from the age of 12 and 2 months, unless a medical exemption applies.) You will still be required to check in using the QR system and show proof of vaccination.

If vaccination status isn't being checked, then Mass numbers are restricted to one person per 4 square metres up to a maximum of 50 people per facility. You will still be required to check in using the QR system
