"INCREASE OUR FAITH!"



Jesus' disciples ask for an increase in faith. I'm sure we have often felt a similar need. It is not always easy being a follower of Jesus. The many troubles of this world can overwhelm us. We certainly need God's help. Jesus reassures his disciples that the smallest amount of faith, even if only the size of a mustard seed, can achieve the seemingly impossible. I think the emphasis on the smallness of the mustard seed is very important here. It leaves no room for presumption or pride. It is so tiny that it cannot trust in its own strength, but in the power and goodness of its Creator. The very littleness of the mustard seed leaves room for the greatness of God's awesome plans for us.

I think the smallness of the mustard seed ties in with the humble service called for in the second part of the Gospel. A servant shouldn't expect any special congratulations or reward for simply doing their duty. In the same way, we shouldn't get ahead of ourselves with boastful thoughts of how much we have done for God. After all, everything comes from him, so whatever we do will always fall short of what we owe. And yet, while we should always hold and foster a spirit of gratitude to God,

that does not limit God's generous response to our humble service. We shouldn't expect anything, and yet we hear elsewhere of what the Good Master promises for the servant he finds faithfully at his duty; "truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them" (Lk 12:37).

How truly generous is our Good God! How many the wonders he works in our lives! I am very blessed in my role to hear many stories of God's loving actions in your lives. Someone stepped into your life just when you needed them. An opportunity came your way just at the right moment. You were able to pull through a prolonged period of anxiety or stress when it all seemed too much. You found clarity and peace when faced with a difficult decision. A relationship was reconciled, or a hurt was healed. You found comfort and strength in times of illness, or were perhaps even restored to health. And perhaps what feels like the greatest gift of all, a loved one came to faith when you least expected it. The list could easily go on. God is most certainly working in our lives. Treasure those experiences, and never be afraid to share them with each other so that we might all be strengthened in faith.

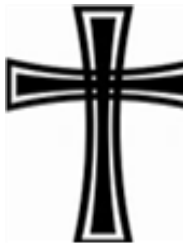

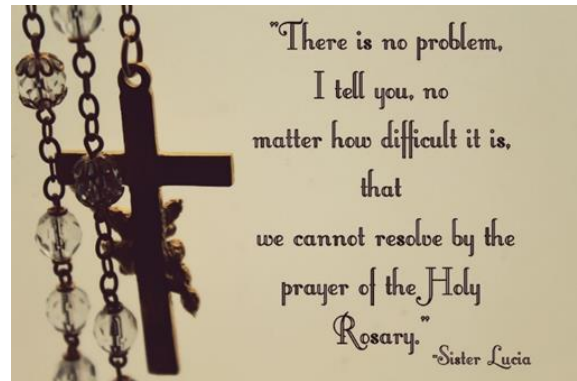

What opportunities exist for you to act out of faith without expectation?

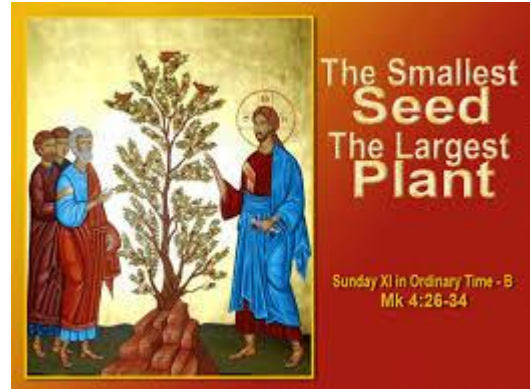

In our struggles to be faithful disciples, we frequently must endure periods when we feel abandoned by God. When we have been intent on serving God with genuine devotion, such times are particularly trying, for one would expect that God would not withdraw consolations. When this happens, the broken heart and the strained spirit cry out to God in complaint: How long? Why? We have all been worn down by life, tempted to give up, too weary to go on.

Faith in God is a gift for which we pray. It enables us to accomplish marvellous feats; with it we can move mountains. As unprofitable servants, we do not earn it; we have no right to claim it as our own. We are the ones from whom faithful service will be expected. We will be sent to plough the fields and tend the sheep. We will be called to serve at table.

The faith that is ours has been mediated to us through the community. We have heard about God and about Jesus from others, from our parents and families, from our teachers and those who preach, from those with whom we work and play. Faith comes from God, but through the mediation of the community. Timothy received faith from his mother and grandmother. It was strengthened in him through the imposition of Paul's hands and through his preaching of the word of God. The just will live by faithfulness.

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes.

Then the Lord answered and said,

'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God.

Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

The word of the Lord stands for ever; it is the word given to you, the Good News. Alleluia!

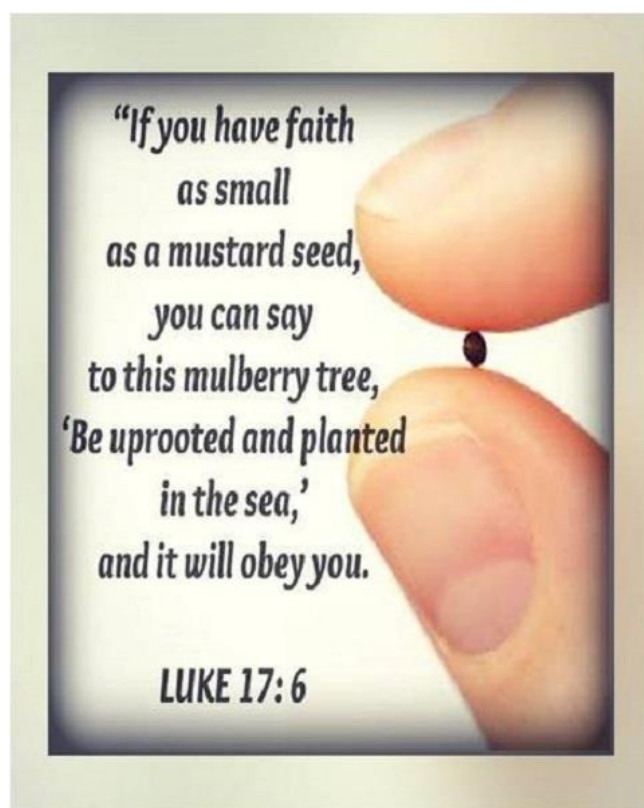
GOSPEL Lk 17:5-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke
If you had faith!

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.

'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."'
