

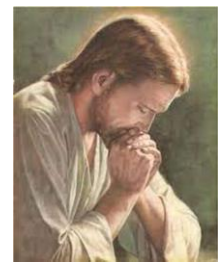

13TH NOVEMBER 2022: THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*YOU WILL BE HATED BY ALL ON ACCOUNT OF MY NAME, BUT NOT A HAIR OF YOUR HEAD WILL BE LOST.
YOUR ENDURANCE WILL WIN YOU YOUR LIVES.*

So here we are again, coming towards the end of another liturgical year, and as always the readings point towards the completion of all things at the end of time. God has his loving plan, and he will bring it to fulfilment, but in the meantime we might have to endure a bit of strife. We aren't short of that at the moment are we? A lot of work has gone into trying to contain property damage from the flooding. Many are anxiously waiting to see what the next few days and weeks will bring. More broadly, the damage already done by excess water to crops has been very significant. For some of our farmers, what was shaping up to be a great year, a bumper harvest, is fast shaping up to be one of the worst. With everything going on, it might be a challenge to keep believing that we are still under God's protection.



Perhaps this reflection might help. Remember the story of the Israelites fleeing Pharaoh to escape slavery in Egypt? And how Moses separated the waters so the people could pass through? Well, just imagine how that was experienced by the average person in the crowd. If you were there, what would you see? Quite likely just the backs of the people in front of you and the wet ground beneath your feet. The crowd behind would keep pushing you forward. Perhaps you might hear some cries, 'the chariots just are behind us.' Eventually the commotion

dies down and you find yourself with a bit more space. The ground is drier. You are climbing higher. There is a strange stillness in the air until someone shouts 'We are saved!'

We don't necessarily always see what God is doing for us. We might be right in the middle of our own Exodus without even realising it. Have faith that we are in his care, and hope that he will carry us through.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:

THE DAY OF FIRE

The end of another church year is near. We can tell because the readings are winding down to the end of the world. It's a cheerful note to end on, if you're a true believer. What could be better than the fulfilment of all of God's promises?

On the other hand, the end-times means the destruction of creation as we know it and a certain amount of real persecution and suffering. There's betrayal and hatred and the chance to plead your case in a court of lies – none of which we look forward to. On the third hand (if we're permitted a third hand), all of those conditions exist right now. We can pretend they're not there and turn a blind eye. But end-time suffering is happening in real time.

Goodness and justice are always on trial. Creation is ever endangered and suffering is no stranger. The old world is on the verge of slipping away. The new creation aches to be born. The end of the world is more familiar than we imagine, and the reign of God closer than we dream.

What part of you pledges allegiance to the old world? What part aches to be reborn?

Give your testimony in favour of the new creation of God's love. Put your time, money, presence, and signature behind a campaign of justice. Let the new creation be born.

The sun of righteousness will dawn on those who honour my name, healing radiating from its wings.

A reading from the prophet Malachi
The sun of righteousness will shine on you.

The day is coming now, burning like a furnace; and all the arrogant and the evildoers will be like stubble. The day that is coming is going to burn them up, says the Lord of hosts, leaving them neither root nor stalk. But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness will shine out with healing in its rays.

Sing psalms to the Lord with the harp with the sound of music. With trumpets and the sound of the horn acclaim the King, the Lord.

Let the sea and all within it, thunder, the world, and all its peoples. Let the rivers clap their hands and the hills ring out their joy at the presence of the Lord.

For the Lord comes, he comes to rule the earth. He will rule the world with justice and the peoples with fairness.

(R.) The Lord comes to rule the earth with justice.

SECOND READING 2 Thes 3:7-12

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

Do not give anyone food who refuses to work.

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Alleluia, alleluia!

Lift up your heads and see; your redemption is near at hand. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Lk 21:5-19

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke
Your endurance will win you your life.

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are staring at now – the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen, but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.' *The Gospel of the Lord.*

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.
