SUNDAY 25TH DECEMBER THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD



AND THIS IS THE NAME THEY GIVE HIM:

WONDER-COUNSELLOR, MIGHTY-GOD, ETERNAL-FATHER, PRINCE-OF-PEACE

Today we celebrate the joyful news; Christ has come into the world! He was born first in history, some 2000 years ago in Bethlelem, and he is born again today in our hearts. We believe this event changed everything; Creation was turned on its head! So why is this child so special? His many names help fill in the picture. He is Emmanuel; 'God-with-us'. There is no more seperation, no more distance. God has come to live among his people. He is Jesus; 'The-Lord-is-Salvation'. The time of waiting is over, our Lord has come to save us from our sins. He is 'Wonderful-Counsellor'; Wisdom to guide us and Light to scatter all darkness. He is the Word that brings life and hope wherever it is heard and received. He is 'Mighty-God'; he has the power to break any shackles that imprison us and the strength to lift any burdens that weigh us down. He will raise us up and heal us. He is 'Eternal-Father'; he will never abandon or forsake us, his love has no end. He is 'Prince-of-Peace'; he conquers all hatred and division, he restores our humanity and brings reconciliation. As you cradle the sacred Host in your hands, renew your 'Yes' and receive him in joy. Let him become for you all that he was sent to be;

FIRST READING *Is 9:1-7*

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase; they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

For all the footgear of battle, every cloak rolled in blood, is burnt and consumed by fire. For there is a child born for us, a son given to us and dominion is laid on his shoulders; and this is the name they give him: Wonder-Counsellor, Mighty-God, Eternal-Father, Prince-of-Peace. Wide is his dominion in a peace that has no end, for the throne of David and for his royal power, which he establishes and makes secure in justice and integrity. From this time onwards and for ever, the jealous love of the Lord of hosts will do this. *The Word of the Lord* .

GOSPEL *Lk 2:1-14*

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Caesar Augustus issued a decree for a census of the whole world to be taken. This census – the first – took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria, and everyone went to his own town to be registered. So Joseph set out from the town of Nazareth in Galilee and travelled up to Judaea, to the town of David called Bethlehem, since he was of David's House and line, in order to be registered together with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to a son, her first-born. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them at the inn. In the countryside close by there were shepherds who lived in the fields and took it in turns to watch their flocks during the night. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone round them. They were terrified, but the angel said, 'Do not be afraid. Listen, I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people. Today in the town of David a saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. And here is a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.' And suddenly with the angel there was a great throng of the heavenly host, praising God and singing:

'Glory to God in the highest heaven and peace to men who enjoy his favour.'
