

CELEBRATED AS THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD

We are going to be a little bit different and celebrate this weekend as the Feast of the Presentation (don't worry, we have permission from the Bishop!). Given so many of us are away for the actual Feast of the Holy Family, I'm hoping we can celebrate the Presentation as our special Parish Feast Day instead.

For one, it involves the Holy Family front and centre. Here are Mary and Joseph with the baby Jesus, bringing him before the Father and entrusting the boy's future to his care. How often do we experience similar scenes here in our parish? We see it every time young parents present their children for baptism, asking for God's blessing for their lives going forward. And not just during baptisms; our parents continually place their trust in God's loving care. The story lives on.



But back to the Gospel, the story is not just about the young. Two important characters also emerge with very special roles to play; the priest Simeon and prophetess Anna. They are both 'well on in years', with deep wisdom and insight born of years of heartfelt prayer and faithful living. They have been waiting patiently for the coming of the Messiah. Their hearts are open and their eyes are sharp. Where so many others walk by God's presence in the little child, they immediately recognise Jesus for who he is and shout out in joy. Their witness gives hope to all who hear, and although their words to Mary and Joseph may be difficult, they help shed light on Jesus' future and the part the Holy Family has to play in God's plan of Salvation. Jesus is destined to be a Light to all the Nations, but not everyone will be ready to accept him. He will face rejection, and Mary will share in that suffering too, but through the struggle God will bring about his people's salvation.

Now back to our own Parish, aren't we also blessed with our own equivalents of Anna and Simeon? I for one greatly appreciate our 'faithful elders', those in our midst who have the deep wisdom and perspective only a life of faithful living can bring. Their patient perseverance through the ups and downs of life help fill us all with hope, and their very lives are an example to us all of what it means to live by the Light of Christ. And that is the beauty of living out our faith in a Parish setting; we are able to build each other up, sharing our joys and struggles, hopes and dreams, so that together we can persevere in hope.



THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

FIRST READING Mal 3:1-4

A reading from the prophet Malachi

The Lord whom you seek will come to his temple.

The Lord God says this: Look, I am going to send my messenger to prepare a way before me. And the Lord you are seeking will suddenly enter his temple; and the angel of the covenant whom you are longing for, yes, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. Who will be able to resist the day of his coming? Who will remain standing when he appears? For he is like the refiner's fire and the fuller's alkali. He will take his seat as refiner and purifier; he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and then they will make the offering to the Lord as it should be made. The offering of Judah and Jerusalem will then be welcomed by the Lord as in former days, as in the years of old.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 23:7-10. R. v.10 (R.) Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord!

O gates, lift up your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory!

Who is the king of glory? The Lord, the mighty, the valiant, the Lord, the valiant in war.

O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory!

Who is he, the king of glory? He, the Lord of armies, he is the king of glory. (R.)

SECOND READING Heb 2:14-18

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews He had to be made like us in all things.

Since all the children share the same blood and flesh, Jesus too shared equally in it, so that by his death he could take away all the power of the devil, who had power over death, and set free all those who had been held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. For it was not the angels that he took to himself; he took to himself descent from Abraham. It was essential that he should in this way become completely like his brothers so that he could be a compassionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion, able to atone for human sins. That is, because he has himself been through temptation he is able to help others who are tempted.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Lk 2:32

Alleluia, alleluia!

This is the light of revelation to the nations, and the glory of your people Israel. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Lk 2:22-40

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *My eyes have seen your saving power.*

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord - observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord – and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons. Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God, and he said:

'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace,

just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.'

As the child's father and mother stood there wondering at the things that were being said about him, Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, 'You see this child: he is destined for the fall and for the rising of many in Israel, destined to be a sign that is rejected — and a sword will pierce your own soul too — so that the secret thoughts of many may be laid bare.'

There was a prophetess also, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was well on in years. Her days of girlhood over, she had been married for seven years before becoming a widow. She was now eighty-four years old and never left the Temple, serving God night and day with fasting and prayer. She came by just at that moment and began to praise God; and she spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Jerusalem.

When they had done everything the Law of the Lord required, they went back to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. Meanwhile the child grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him. The Gospel of the Lord.
