


# 5<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2023 2<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY OF LENT

### 'THIS IS MY SON, THE BELOVED; HE ENJOYS MY FAVOUR. LISTEN TO HIM.'

Jesus takes Peter, James and John with him up the mountain. While there, he is transfigured in their presence; 'His face shone like the Sun and his clothes became as white as light.' While the three disciples are still trying to make sense of what they are seeing, a cloud overshadows them and they hear a Voice, 'This is my Son... Listen to Him.' They fall on their faces in fear until Jesus encourages them, 'Stand up, do not be afraid.' And then they look up and see only Jesus.

So what is going on? What does it all mean? Well, there is a lot, lot more to it all than I can dish out in half a page, but for the moment let's just focus on what the disciples see and what they hear. They see Jesus in all his glory, 'transfigured.' I keep finding myself wanting to simplify this by saying 'They see Jesus for who he truly is,' but that is not quite accurate. The Jesus they have seen walking alongside them all this time is just as true and real, as will be the sight of Jesus crucified on the Cross. Their eyes haven't been deceiving them thus far, but in the Transfiguration they are given a glimpse of



something that has so far been veiled or hidden from their sight; the presence of the Divine. They then hear the voice which confirms and explains what they have just seen; Jesus is the Beloved Son of the Father. They can trust in him. They should listen to him and follow his way, because that is the true and only Way to the Father. The disciples hear this now to strengthen them for the road ahead- it is not going to be an easy one.

The same is also true for us. We need to continually reaffirm our faith that Jesus *is* the Beloved Son of the Father. We can indeed trust in him. We can most certainly rely on him. When we hear his voice, we hear the Father's voice calling us to fullness of life. That voice often challenges us. Sometimes it asks us to leave behind behaviours that hurt us (sin). Sometimes it asks us to leave aside certain comforts or indulgences that are weighing us down. Sometimes it asks us take up our own Cross, persevering through times of suffering and trial. But at all times we know we can trust that voice, and at all times it calls us forth into new life.

#### **REFLECTION** by Dianne Bergant CSA

The blessings upon which we meditate today are undeserved gifts from God. They were not earned. The graciousness of God transforms us in such a way as to effect new beginnings. It can be seen in the promises made to Abram. He leaves the past behind and moves into a new future. It can be seen in the psalm response. The Lord delivers us from death and inspires us to look to the future. It can be seen in the reading from 2 Timothy. Through Christ Jesus we are called to a new life of holiness; we escape the fetters of death and are brought into the freedom of the resurrection. We see it in the gospel, a glimpse into the future glory of Jesus which, through grace, we will be able to share. Lent is a time of new beginnings which find their origin in the abundant blessings of God.

The ultimate blessing of God is Jesus himself. As Abram was called to be the source of blessing for all others, as Peter, James and John were chosen to witness the transfiguration of Jesus, so today we too are invited to look to Jesus for inspiration during this holy season. Paul speaks of the salvation that Jesus brings as having come, not because of any works of righteousness that we might have performed, but because of the grace of God. Once again the Lenten readings focus on the merciful action of God in our lives, and in the end they point to Jesus.

# **RESPONSORIAL PSALM** Ps 32:4-5. 18-20. 22. R. v.22 (R.) Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

The word of the Lord is faithful and all his works to be trusted. The Lord loves justice and right and fills the earth with his love.

The Lord looks on those who revere him, on those who hope in his love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Our soul is waiting for the Lord. The Lord is our help and our shield. May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

## (R.) Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

#### SECOND READING 2 Tm 1:8-10

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy God has saved us, and called us to be holy.

With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News. The Word of the Lord.

#### **GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Mt 17:5**

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

#### **GOSPEL** Mt 17:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew: *His face shone like the sun.* 

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
