We give thanks today for all our Mothers and Grandmothers, and for all those women who have cared for us in a special way. In the very, very least, we all owe our lives to our mother. As we were formed within her, her very body was our first home, and as we grew, we were nourished by her very life. But it doesn't stop there! We count on our mother's for so much! They are called to nurture and care for us, especially when we aren't able to care for ourselves. As our first teachers, they are the first to correct us. But as our fiercest advocates, they are the last to abandon us. So often they are asked to put our good before their own. Their very example of devotion, sacrifice and unconditional love teaches us life's most important lessons; that we are loveable, that we are loved, and that we ourselves are called to love in our turn.

I know I am blessed, because I have always had my mum by my side, and still do. I realise though that for many this is not the case. As we pray for and give thanks for all our mothers, we also pray in a special way for those who are no longer with us. We pray too for all mothers who themselves are missing their children, and for any who might be grieving a relationship that was wounded or broken. For a while we may suffer the pain of separation, but with the eyes of faith, we live in the sure hope that love always has the final word.



"I WILL NOT LEAVE YOU ORPHANS"

It is no accident that Jesus gave us his own Mother as his last act before he died. All of us can find in Mary a comforter and guide. In a deeply symbolic way, this act also pointed in Mystery to his gift of the Church, who we also look to as our Mother. It was the Church who gave birth to the life of Christ within us, and it was

She who formed and continues to nurture our faith. But even over and above these tremendous gifts, he also left us His Spirit. It was the Spirit who breathed across the waters to give life to all Creation. It was the Spirit who breathed life into each of us as we were formed in the womb. And it is from the

Spirit that we all continue to draw life and strength. The Holy Spirit is our Paraclete; our tireless Helper and most faithful Advocate, our safest Refuge and firmest Defender, our closest Comforter and deepest Consoler. How special is it that we had this Gospel today? For many of us, it was our mothers who first taught us what these words truly mean. And so, once again, let us pray for all our mothers, and for all who like mothers give life and keep us in their loving care.

What are some of the ways Christians believe the Holy Spirit acts in the world today?


How can you be an agent of the Holy Spirit?

GOSPEL REFLECTION BY FR MICHAEL TATE PARALLEL TRUTHS

Today's Gospel speaks of an advocate. This translates a Greek word: 'paraclete'. Our Lord says: 'I will send you another Paraclete to be with you forever.' Our Lord was a Paraclete, and he would send another.

What does this strange sounding word mean? Here is a hint. We all know that parallel lines run, well, para-llel. They run alongside each other. A paraclete is a person who stands alongside someone and pleads their case.

That is how our Lord Jesus Christ saw himself. His role was not to condemn but to plead the case for mercy and compassion, to be the intercessor par excellence.

Our Lord promises another Paraclete dwelling within us, individually and as the body of Christ's disciples, the Holy Spirit advocating our cause, assisting us to live Truth-fully by the measure of the One who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. This Paraclete particularly assists us by acting as the Spirit of Truth.

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the two Paracletes, constantly pleading our case before the Throne of Mercy.

FIRST READING Acts 8:5-8. 14-17 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 65:1-7. 16. 20. R. see v.1 (R.) Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

Cry out with joy to God all the earth, O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise. Say to God: 'How tremendous your deeds!

'Before you all the earth shall bow; shall sing to you, sing to your name!' Come and see the works of God, tremendous his deeds among men.

He turned the sea into dry land, they passed through the river dry-shod. Let our joy then be in him; he rules for ever by his might.

Come and hear, all who fear God. I will tell what he did for my soul: Blessed be God who did not reject my prayer nor withhold his love from me.

SECOND READING 1 Pt 3:15-18

A reading from the first letter of St Peter In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

I will not leave you orphans; I will come back to you. In a short time the world will no longer see me; but you will see me, because I live and you will live.

On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you.

Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I shall love him and show myself to him.'
