'IF ANYONE WANTS TO BE A FOLLOWER OF MINE, LET HIM RENOUNCE HIMSELF AND TAKE UP HIS CROSS AND FOLLOW ME...'

Being a follower of Jesus is not easy. If we are really taking his words seriously, we are constantly challenged to go out of ourselves in love and to hold onto certain truths that are unpopular. This has never been easy but is perhaps more difficult given how high a value our contemporary society places on comfort. Setting down our Cross and giving up the fight has perhaps never seemed so attractive an alternative. And yet, here we are, because we know that would go against our deepest yearnings. We need something more than mere comfort. We can only be fulfilled by Truth and Love, and we firmly believe we find that in following Christ.

The prophet Jeremiah puts it so powerfully. In the face of insult and derision, he decides to shut his mouth, and no longer speak the words God is putting there. But then, "there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones." He just couldn't hold it in any longer. In order to be true to himself, he was ready suffer for the sake of God's ways. And that was some 500 years before Christ's Death and Resurrection. As we face our own trials, we have that awesome mystery to strengthen and encourage us.

Being faithful to Christ calls for sacrifice, even at times a readiness to face suffering- especially the suffering of rejection. But in whatever challenges we may find ourselves, no matter how high a cost love demands of us, we know that Christ has already gone before us and so will surely see us through. We are never on our own.

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

I was chatting with a couple in preparation for the baptism of their first child and asked the dad if he had noticed how fatherhood had changed him. His face lit up and he said, yes, and in ways he had never expected. He had always loved staying for a drink with the boys after footy, but now it just didn't interest him. Instead, he just wanted to get home and spend time with his little champion. His little son had suddenly become the most important thing in his life. Nothing else could compare.

I know it isn't always so easy, but dads really are called to reset their whole lives around their family. Just like today's Gospel, often that means renouncing themselves and being ready to sacrifice. Our families need good dads. Our world needs loving fathers. We pray this weekend for all our dads. Thank you for striving to put your children first.



FIRST READING Jeremiah 20:7-9 A reading from the prophet Jeremiah The word of the Lord God has meant derision for me. You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more. Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it. The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 62:2-6. 8-9. R. v.2 (R.) My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting. My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water.

So I gaze on you in the sanctuary to see your strength and your glory. For your love is better than life, my lips will speak your praise.

So I will bless you all my life, in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy.

For you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast.

(R.) My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

SECOND READING Romans 12:1-2

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans May you present your bodies as a living sacrifice.

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION See Ephesians 1:17-18 Alleluia, alleluia!

May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our heart, that we might see how great is the hope to which we are called. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Matthew 16:21-27

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.' The Gospel of the Lord.
