17TH MARCH 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

UNLESS A GRAIN OF WHEAT SHALL FALL....



Every time a farmer sows a crop, they are taking a risk. There are many factors beyond their control that can diminish their return of investment-bad weather, pests, disease, low prices... even finding the labour to bring in the harvest. Now think about the risk for a farmer in Jesus' day. The seed they sowed was the same grain they relied on for food. If the season was a bad one, they risked going hungry. Once the grain is in the ground, you can't eat it anymore. But the risk had to be taken... if you stopped sowing, the grain pit would eventually run empty.

Christ took on a huge risk when he accepted his mission. He knew it would end in his death, just as the seed 'dies' when it is sown. Would the sacrifice be worth it? He gives us everything he has but will not force us to love him in return. Would we open our hearts to receive his gift? Or just like bad weather and disease, would pride or fear make for a poor harvest? But the risk would not deter him; the seed was sown.

And what about us? Will we follow where he has led? Will we take the risk of receiving his love, and respond by giving the gift of ourselves? Will we 'lose our life' in love so that we may keep it into eternity? After all, our days in this life are limited. Like the grain pit, if we refuse to sow, it will eventually run empty.

I've heard it said that the phrase Jesus uses more than any other is 'Do not be afraid.' I like that, because I need to hear it a lot! Yes, there is a risk in following Christ, but what are we afraid of? Everything we have comes from him anyway, so in giving it back, we have nothing to lose.

"Are we not perhaps all afraid in some way? If we let Christ enter fully into our lives, if we open ourselves totally to him, are we not afraid to give up something significant, something unique, something that makes life so beautiful? Do we not then risk ending up diminished and deprived of our freedom? And once again the Pope (John Paull II) said: No! If we let Christ into our lives, we lose nothing, nothing, absolutely nothing of what makes life free, beautiful and great. No! Only in this friendship are the doors of life opened wide. Only in this friendship is the great potential of human existence truly revealed. Only in this friendship do we experience beauty and liberation. And so, today, with great strength and great conviction, on the basis of long personal experience of life, I say... Do not be afraid of Christ! He takes nothing away, and gives you everything. When we give ourselves to him, we receive a hundredfold in return. Yes, open, open wide the doors to Christ- and you will find true life. Amen."



FREE SCREENING: THE CHOSEN



FIRST READING Jeremiah 31:31-34

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah.

The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with Israel and I will forgive their iniquity.

See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks - since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 50:3-4. 12-15. R. v.12

(R.) Create a clean heart in me, O God.

Have mercy on me, God, in your kindness. In your compassion blot out my offence. O wash me more and more from my guilt. and cleanse me from my sin.

A pure heart create for me, O God, put a steadfast spirit within me.

Do not cast me away from your presence, nor deprive me of your holy spirit.

Give me again the joy of your help; with a spirit of fervour sustain me, that I may teach transgressors your ways and sinners may return to you. (R.)

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 12:26

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! If you serve me, follow me, says the Lord; and where I am, my servant will also be. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL John 12:20-33

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come

for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you most solemnly,

unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies,

it remains only a single grain;

but if it dies,

it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world

will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.

Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.


'Now sentence is being passed on this world;
