# 2ND JUNE 2024 THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST 'THIS IS MY BODY...'



Today we celebrate an awesome mystery; that the Risen Jesus is really and truly present to us in the Eucharist. At the Last Supper, Jesus took some bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, 'This is my Body.' He then took the cup, blessed it and gave it to his disciples saying, 'This is my Blood'. Faithful to his command to 'Do this in memory of me,' this simple but awesome sign has been handed down through history, right down to us today. We too take the bread and wine, just as he taught us. We bless it, and by the power of his Word and the working of the Holy Spirit, it truly becomes for us his Body and Blood. We cannot see the change with our eyes, but by faith we believe in his word and in his promise. What still looks like bread and wine, and still tastes like

bread and wine, has really and truly become his Body and Blood. By faith we believe that Jesus is really present in the Eucharist. He gives himself to us every time we approach the Eucharist. He gives everything he is; his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. He holds nothing back, giving his whole self. Why? Because he loves us. He loves us with his whole being, and he wants us to know that love, right down to the innermost depths of our heart. Jesus not only wants us to know his love ever more deeply, he also wants us to be truly transformed by that love. Just as the bread and wine are changed by his Word and the working of the Holy Spirit, we are also changed by the Eucharist. Or at least, that is his invitation.

Jesus gives us his Body in the Eucharist, so that we might become his Body. When we approach the Eucharist, and the sacred host is held up before us, we hear the words, 'The Body of Christ.' We say 'Amen', meaning, 'Yes' or 'I assent'. So what are we saying 'Yes' to? First, we say our 'Yes' in faith, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, and that what was bread has now become his Body. But our 'Yes' goes further still. We are saying 'Yes' not only to what Jesus has done to the Bread, we are also saying our 'Yes to the awesome change Jesus plans to bring about in us too. We are saying 'Yes'; we are truly becoming Christ's Body here on earth. Because that is exactly what the Church is; the Body of Christ here on earth. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist we renew that call and strengthen that identity. We carry forward that presence of Christ to all the world, acting as his hands and his feet, and little by little and bit by bit he perfects our Communion with each other and patiently completes his plan that all Peoples and all Creation will be united in his love.

And that is surely worth saying Amen to!

#### TO ALL THE CHILDREN MAKING THEIR FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS TODAY ...

Don't be afraid to say your Amen to all that Jesus has planned for you! You will receive him in the Eucharist for the first time today, and if you are willing this is the beginning of an awesome journey. You have a part in building up his Body that no-one else has, you can share his love in a way completely unique to you. Open your heart to Jesus' plan for you, and give him your 'Amen', your 'Yes' to all that he has in store!

#### **REFLECTION** by Nick Brodie

Pope Francis points out that at the Last Supper Jesus 'breaks himself apart'. In doing so, the Pope suggests, Jesus shows his followers 'that the aim of life lies in self-giving.'

The Pope reminds us that 'we find the greatness of God in a piece of Bread, in a fragility that overflows with love, that overflows with sharing.' In the fragility of the Eucharist, the Pope adds, we find 'the strength of the love that becomes small so it can be welcomed and not feared.'

The Pope also highlights how the Eucharist reveals 'the strength to love those who made mistakes.' It was on the night he was betrayed, with Judas at the table, that Jesus 'responds to Judas' "no" with the "yes" of mercy.'

'When we receive the Eucharist,' the Pope explains, 'Jesus does the same with us: he knows us; he knows we are sinners; and he knows we make many mistakes, but he does not give up on joining his life to ours. He knows that we need it, because the Eucharist is not the reward of saints, no, it is the Bread of sinners.'

'The Eucharist,' the Pope says, 'is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak.' That being the case, this Sunday we might do well to ask ourselves what situation or person we are being strengthened to help. © Nick Brodie

## READINGS NEXT WEEK: 10TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15 Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1 Gospel: Mark 3:20-35

#### FIRST READING - Exodus 24:3-8

Covenant between God and the Israelites is sealed in blood.

A reading from the book of Exodus

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standingstones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.'

Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people.

'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

## **RESPONSORIAL PSALM** Ps 115:12-13. 15-18. R. v.13 (R.) I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord.

How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me? The cup of salvation I will raise; I will call on the Lord's name.

O precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his faithful. Your servant, Lord, your servant am I; you have loosened my bonds.

A thanksgiving sacrifice I make: I will call on the Lord's name. My vows to the Lord I will fulfil before all his people. (R.)

A reading from the First Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming to his death.

The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 6:51-52

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live for ever.
Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark This is my body. This is my blood.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'

After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives. *The Gospel of the Lord.*
