THE HUNGER ONLY GOD CAN SATISFY

Last week we heard of how Jesus miraculously fed the crowd with just a few loaves and fishes after seeing their hunger. He filled their bellies until they couldn't eat anymore... and now they are back for more! But this time around Jesus wants them to recognise the deeper hunger within them. All of us have need of spiritual nourishment. Just like we need food, water and air, we also need to be filled up with God's grace and love, and indeed need it even more than physical food. Whether we have many years left, or just a few, eventually these bodies of ours will pack it in. And even now, in this body that needs daily nourishment, we can recognise that we need far more than food to flourish and live life to the full. We need connection and relationship, meaning and purpose, forgiveness and reconciliation, hope and love. Jesus has come to fill that deeper hunger within us. He is the Bread of Life; ready to satisfy our deepest needs, both in the here and now and right through into eternity.

Now don't get me wrong, this is not to dismiss our physical needs. We aren't angels, we need food, and we certainly can't ignore the needs of the poor. That is not the point, as Jesus makes abundantly clear elsewhere. But again, we need much more than just physical nourishment. Jesus did not dismiss the hunger of the crowd, but fed them out of compassion for their needs. But he also performed the miracle as a sign of their deeper, spiritual hunger, and as a sign that he had come with the power to satisfy those deeper needs. And as a sign it pointed forward to the awesome gift he would leave his Church, the miraculous feast that we come to each week to find the nourishment we need; the Eucharist. If someone asks you why you bother going to Mass, you can answer quite simple, 'Because I am hungry, and that is where I am fed.'

GOSPEL REFLECTION

SCRIPTURAL CONTEXT - BREAD THAT ENDURES

Jesus says, 'Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life.' The reference to food that cannot last relates to today's first reading about manna. In the full account of Exodus 16 you will see that the manna that fell on the first five days had become rotten by the next day and could not be eaten. However, the manna that fell on the sixth day was 'food that endures' so that it could

be eaten the next day – the Sabbath day, when the work of gathering the manna was not allowed.

LIVING THE GOSPEL - THE BODY OF CHRIST

Christ is present in the Eucharist in many forms: in the people gathered; in the celebrating priest; in the Word proclaimed; and in the consecrated bread and wine – the Body and Blood of Christ. In relation to receiving Christ through the reception of communion, St Augustine wrote, 'Be what you see, and receive what you are.' We not only receive the Body of Christ through Eucharist, we are called to be the Body of Christ because of what we have received; and we receive the Body of Christ because we are already part of the Body of Christ.

HISTORICAL CONTEXT - BREAD

For thousands of years, bread has been a staple part of the human diet in many cultures. It is no accident that the image of Jesus as bread makes such a significant appearance in the gospel of John. For the Jews, like other Ancient Near Eastern cultures, bread was a vital mainstay of their diet. In the Bible, the word 'bread' often simply means all food – it was that important! For many, regular access to bread did equate to life. Bread also played a crucial role in religious practices, especially the Passover meal.

FIRST READING Exodus 16:2-4. 12-15

A reading from the book of Exodus
I will rain bread from heaven upon you.

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our hearts content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.' 'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your hearts content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God." And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.' The Word of the Lord. RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 77:3-4. 23-25. 54. R. v.24

(R.) The Lord gave them bread from heaven.

SECOND READING Ephesians 4:17, 20-24 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

Put on the new person that has been created in God's image.

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life;

you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you,
for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'
Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the
works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is

So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered: 'I am the bread of life.
