



LITTLE ACTS OF KINDNESS FOR LENT


Sing a song of worship together as a family. (Psalm 100:2 – "Worship the Lord with gladness.")

Do something kind for someone in secret today. (Matt 6:3 – "When you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing.")

Invite someone new to sit with you at lunch or church or play with you at recess. (Romans 15:7 – "Accept one another, just as Christ accepted you.")

Pray together as a family and thank God for all the ways you've shared kindness this Lent! (Col 3:17 – "Whatever you do, do it all in the name of Jesus.")

Final Prayer: Lord, thank You for showing us how to love others. Help us to keep sharing kindness beyond Lent. Amen.

FIRST READING Isaiah 50:4-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah I did not cover my face against insult and I know I will not be ashamed.

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue.

So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech.

Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple.

The Lord has opened my ear.

For my part, I made no resistance,

neither did I turn away.

I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard;

I did not cover my face against insult and spittle.

The Lord comes to my help,

so that I am untouched by the insults.

So, too, I set my face like flint;

I know I shall not be shamed.

The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM Ps 21:8-9, 17-20, 23-24, R, v, 2 (R.) My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

All who see me deride me.

They curl their lips, they toss their heads. 'He trusted in the Lord, let him save him; let him release him if this is his friend.'

Many dogs have surrounded me, a band of the wicked beset me. They tear holes in my hands and my feet. I can count every one of my bones.

They divide my clothing among them. They cast lots for my robe. O Lord, do not leave me alone, my strength, make haste to help me!

I will tell of your name to my brethren and praise you where they are assembled. 'You who fear the Lord give him praise; all sons of Jacob, give him glory.

Revere him, Israel's sons.' (R.)

SECOND READING Philippians 2:6-11 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians He humbled himself to become like us and God raised

His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling

him on high.

to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord,

to the glory of God the Father. The Word of the Lord. ALL: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Philippians 2:8-9

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! Christ became obedient for us even to death dving on the cross.

Therefore God raised him on high and gave him a name above all other names. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!
